Thomas Triscari, 80, of Liverpool, passed away Monday at the Francis House surrounded by his loving family. He was born in Jamestown, NY and resided in the Syracuse area for most of his life. Thomas was an U.S. Army veteran of the Korean War. He was a communicant of St. Margaret's Church. Thomas owned and operated Thomas Hair Stylist at 123 W. Fayette Street for more than 40 years and still continued to work as a stylist for another 20 years. He enjoyed traveling, Syracuse Basketball and Football, the NY Yankees and relaxing in the sun. Thomas will be greatly missed by his family and all who knew him. He is survived by his loving wife, Sharon C. (Casale) Triscari; six children, Valerie Ware of Long Island, Chris Foran of Long Island, Lori (Doug) Hazillief of St. Petersburg, FL, Brian D. (Melissa) Thomas of Syracuse, Heather L. 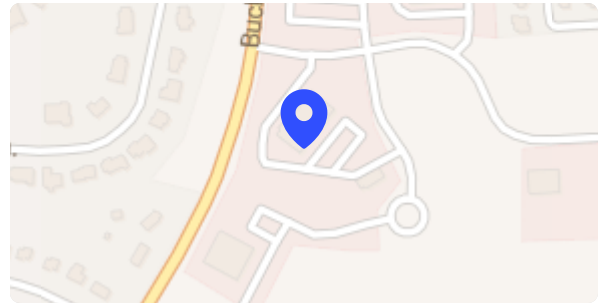

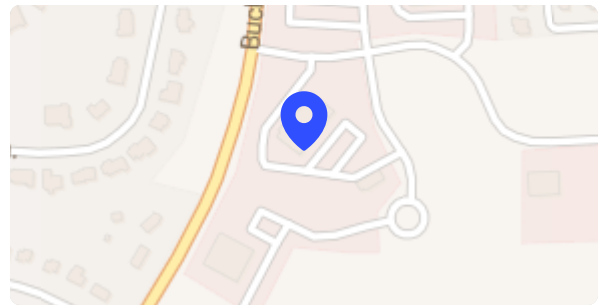

Mr. Triscari lived across the street from my family on Colony Park Drive in Liverpool. I had just turned 5 and my mother sent me across the street to play with the 3 Triscari girls. That family became a huge part of my life growing up. Although he was only 8 years younger than my own father, Mr. Triscari seemed SO MUCH cooler (sorry Dad). During the Blizzard of 1966 we were snowed in for what seemed like a week. Driving was out of the question. All the stores and restaurants were closed. My family, along with one or two others, managed to tunnel across the street to the Triscari's house where we shared food and laughs and created once-in-a-lifetime memories. I was fortunate to enjoy extended stays at the Triscari's Adirondack Mountains camp in Eagle Bay. Most weekends Mr. Triscari would drive up, try to unwind for a bit, and drive back to Syracuse for another week of beautifying the hair of the women in Syracuse. In the 70's my father owned a small shopping plaza in Mattydale. Right in the heart of the Disco Era, Mr. Triscari opened a hot spot called the Sugar Mill (Pepper Mill?) practically across the street from my father's business. I absolutely hated Disco music but I got a kick out of visiting the place in the company of his gorgeous daughter (and my oldest friend) Valerie. I can't stop looking at the picture of Mr. Triscari in the upper left hand corner of my computer screen. He always seemed larger than life to me. He wasn't a tall & imposing figure but when he walked into a room you knew he had arrived. One of my favorite memories is going downtown with Valerie once we were old enough to go by ourselves. There were 3 mandatory stops: The peanut shop run by the mean old ladies (I'm sure they were nice but to 11 year-olds they seemed mean) for hot, fresh roasted peanuts, the bookstore to look at used magazines, and Mr. Triscari's shop. Val and I would pop in and there Mr. Triscari would be in all his grandeur - cutting hair, being charming, joking, laughing, and the life of the party. He was so full of life. I haven't seen him in a long, long time but I will miss him. He would cross paths with my older sister Sandy and ask about me. I would hear about him from Val. I offer my deepest sympathies to Mr. Triscari's family and friends. As I alluded to earlier, I met Valerie as a 5 year-old knocking on her door. I have known her longer than anyone in my life outside of my own family. She lost her sweet, wonderful mother decades ago - and now she has lost Mr. Triscari. I lost both of my parents over the last several years. Here is the thing - they are not here anymore - but they aren't really gone. They are right there buried in your heart and etched into your mind. They appear at the oddest times in things we say, things we do or in technicolor dreams. Our lives are an amalgamation of all the experiences we have had and all of the people who have touched our lives. Mr. Triscari certainly touched mine.
