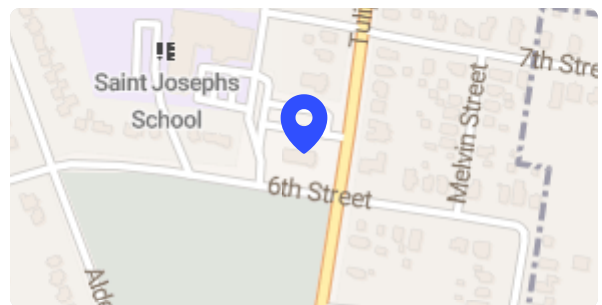

If you had the pleasure of knowing her you can believe she is playing the slots and drinking a beer as we gather here today in memory of her. Let me tell you a few things about my mom, she made the best Christmas cookies ever, her apple pie was amazing, and I never knew how good stake was until I moved out and came back for dinner. She was an amazing cook. Margie (as I liked to call her) was a wonderful, Witty and social person with a bright smile and a fantastic sense of humor. She loved to laugh. She always tried to see the good in people and tried to instill that in all of us. Marge touched each and every one of us in some way or another. She is at peace, in a much better place and looking down on us. If she were still here she would not want to see us shed a tear or wallow in our sorrow.
