In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to Francis House.




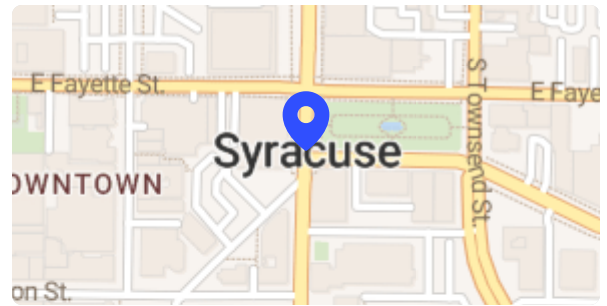
