AUG 28, 1944 - JUN 12, 2020

Anthony "Tony" Jude Sciacca, Sr. of Liverpool, devoted husband, father, grandfather/papa, brother, neighbor, and friend passed away peacefully on June 12, 2020 at age 75 surrounded by the love of family and friends.

Born on August 28, 1944 in his beloved hometown of Syracuse, NY, Tony graduated from Liverpool High School and received an associate degree from Onondaga Community College/University College. Tony was employed by The Coca-Cola Company, Charles Plumbing & Heating, and Case Supply, Inc. A parishioner of Christ the King Church and Commissioned Lay Minister, Tony nurtured individuals with their faith formation through involvement with religious education, Formation for Ministry, and RCIA. Tony also served on the Parish Council, was a parish trustee and assisted with the HOPE Appeal. Always one to support his kids any way he could, Tony volunteered as a coach for both the Liverpool Girls' Softball League and the Seneca River North Little League.

First and foremost, Tony was a family man. His greatest joy in life was spending time and sharing stories with family, friends, and especially his treasured grandchildren. Always ready with a smile, joke, or enduring life lesson, Tony cherished above all else his role as grandpa/papa. Tony was loved for his kind and compassionate spirit, charming personality, and enduring loyalty. A lifelong fan of the NY Yankees and the Syracuse University basketball and football teams, Tony cheered for his teams with pride and passion.

Tony was predeceased by his mother, Louise Mary Camuso; father, Anthony Paul Sciacca, and sister, Carmel Ann Sciacca, who died at birth. 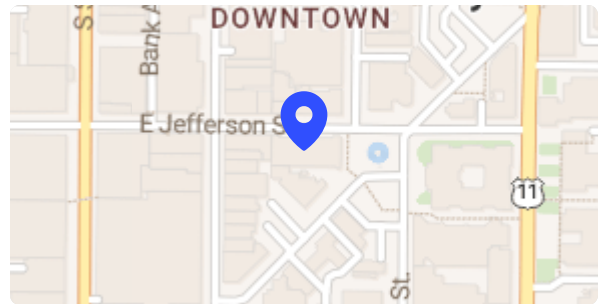

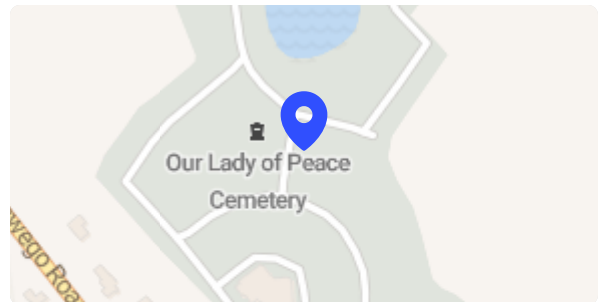
