**L**ewis W. “Woody” Clark, Jr., 66, of Cicero, passed away Saturday, February 27, 2021, at home with his family by his side. Woody was born in Syracuse on October 21, 1954 to the late Lewis and Helen (Dines) Clark. He graduated from CNS High School in 1972 and attended college at SUNY Canton from 1974-1976, where he received an Associate Degree in HVAC Engineering Technology. Woody was a dedicated employee of Carrier Corporation for over 30 years. His interests included motorsports, classic cars, auto mechanics, SU sports, science fiction, spending time outdoors, and building computers.

Woody is survived by his wife of 42 years, Karen Clark; daughter, Stephanie Clark Sundberg, her spouse Kenneth Sundberg Jr.; and grandchildren, Matthew and Shayla.

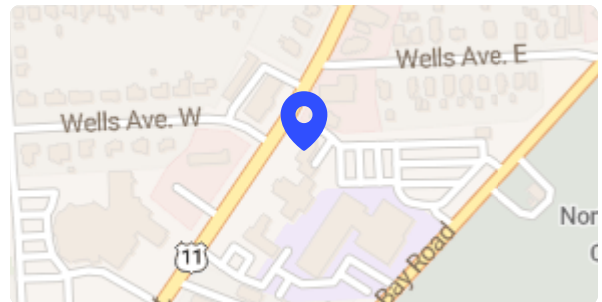

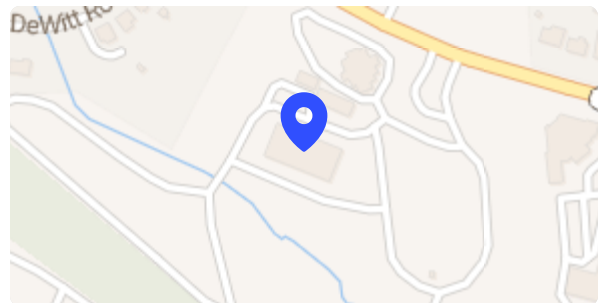

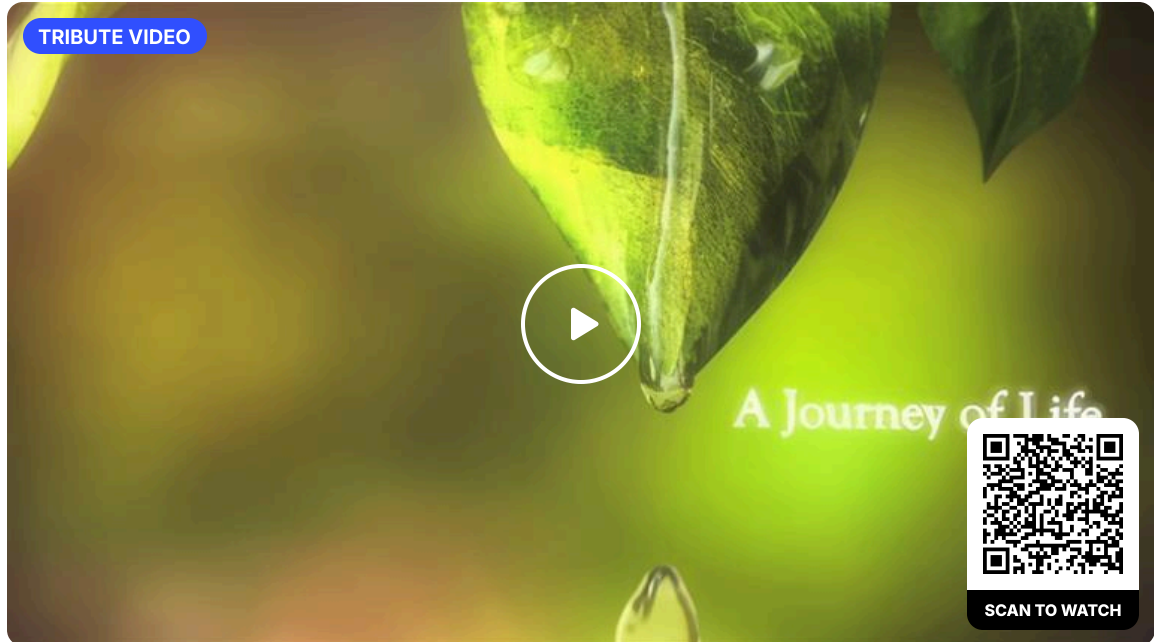
