In keeping with Saverio's wishes, there will be no services. He will be laid to rest in Onondaga County Veterans Memorial Cemetery.

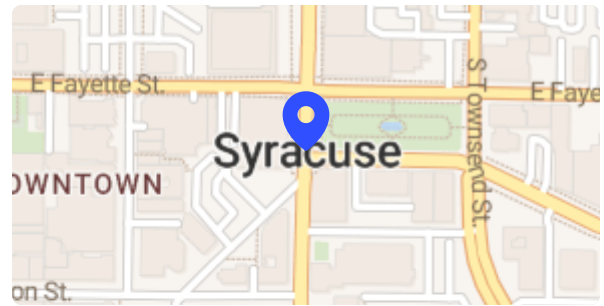
